Many times, the flight crew does not get to reconnect with patients they served. This reunion allows pilots, flight nurses and other members of the GAT team to reunite with patients they've cared for. PAINTFEST AT NAH

The Foundation for Hospital Art (FHA) celebrated its 40th anniversary by holding a PaintFest at multiple hospitals along Interstate 40. The mission of FHA is to bring comfort and hope to people in health care facilities around the world. NAH was one of six hospitals selected to participate in this event. Our colleagues voted beforehand to paint three murals during the event on June 4, which also welcomed patients and family members. These murals were generously donated to our organization and will be featured across our campuses.



NAHOSC RANKS AS TOP 1%

Northern Arizona Healthcare Orthopedic Surgery Center (NAHOSC) was recently named one of the best Ambulatory Surgery Centers (ASC) for orthopedics and spine by U.S. News & World Report. This rating has put NAHOSC in the top 1% of ambulatory surgical centers in Arizona (6,000 nationwide, 212 in Arizona). NAHOSC was one of 10 ASCs in Arizona to be recognized and the only one in northern Arizona region with this stellar ranking.



SAFE SLEEP CERTIFICATION

Each year, over 1,400 babies are born at Northern Arizona Healthcare. Our center is a Birthing Friendly Designated Organization through Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. A goal of the Women and Infant Services department at NAH is to become safe-sleep certified. The final step to reach this certification is the ability to provide a sleep sack for each family once they are discharged from the hospital. Providing a sleep sack to families will allow the nursing staff to model safe sleep practices and assist parents so they feel prepared once their baby is ready to go home.

NORTHERN ARIZONA EMS PEDIATRIC SYMPOSIUM

Northern Arizona Emergency Medical Services (EMS) hosted the 15th annual Pediatric Symposium this spring and was sponsored by the Office of Philanthropy. NAH's trauma services and pediatrics teams attended and presented at the event. Child abuse, orthopedics and toxicology were topics of discussion. Simulation labs were made available to allow attendees to practice assessment and practical skills on pediatric manikins. NAH's sponsorship also supported scholarships that allowed nine rural EMS providers to attend for free.
